## Making your bleach sanitizer solution:

It doesn't take much!

To make an effective bleach sanitizer solution all you need is 1 ounce of bleach in 1 gallon of water! Too much bleach and you can leave chemical residue behind on your surface, take the color out of your clothes, dry out your hands, and irritate your lungs.

Have a designated spray bottle or bucket for your bleach solutions. The concentration of bleach will decrease over time due to evaporation, and due to any introduced food scraps or dirt (when using cloth in bucket of bleach sanitizer).

Change your spray bottle of bleach sanitizer every 1-2days.

Change your bucket of bleach sanitizer every 2 hours. The concentration of bleach in your bucket will get used up fast when introducing food scraps or dirt from your cloth into the bucket. It is always a good idea to rinse your cloth in the sink before placing back in the bucket. When not using your cloth place it back into the bleach bucket, or bacteria can multiply on the cloth, and you can spread it around the kitchen.





NEVER mix soap with bleach or any other sanitizer as it can cause harm to you, and it will reduce the effectiveness of the sanitizer. Soap and water are good for removing dirt and grease, and preparing the surface (making it clean) for the sanitizer to work. Remember: sanitizer cannot penetrate through dirt, grease, & food! The surface should be cleaned first! Same rule with hand washing, and with washing dishes. Always wash, rinse, and sanitize.
